The Conference

Asia has emerged as a pivotal region for global transformation in the *spatial* organization of political, socio-economic relations and transactions, articulated in intra -or inter- country flows and networks of activity, interaction and power. The conference to be held at the Universitas Indonesia (UI) will provide a valuable opportunity to encourage 'Asian Knowledge' and share 'Asian experience' on the above fields. To be specific, it has three objectives, viz., (i) To foster exchange of ideas and academic experience in the multi disciplinary fields of Indonesian and Asian studies, (ii) To establish research collaboration between KAAS and UI through academic and cultural exchange, and (iii) To promote interaction among researchers/policy makers of Asian Countries. For the purpose, it will explore some key issues revolving around the aspects of domestic politics, inter-state relationship, historical and social transformation, development with housing, and disaster management in Asia.

Universitas Indonesia

Universitas Indonesia, abbreviated as UI, was founded in 1849 and now is the leading tertiary-level educational institution in Indonesia. UI is also actively contributes to strengthen and enlarge international network by actively participating in both regional as well as international education and research association. UI campus is one of green campuses in the world. UI maintains the ecology conservation by utilizing only 25 percent of area for academic, research and student activities; while up hold 75 percent for forestation. UI commitment for ecology is also shown by wonderful lakes (in total UI has 8 lakes) inside campus. UI has two campuses; one is in the central business in Jakarta (Salemba) and the second one is located in Depok areas (West Java). Depok campus is a green campus covering 320 hectares. UI facilitates knowledge transfers and invention activities for all civitas-

academica of UI and humanity. UI has produced more than 400.000 alumni and continues its important role both nationally and internationally. Furthermore, UI has also committed to produce high quality of education system, global standard research activities and maintaining high standard of international academic research publications.

Accommodation and Travel

Depok campus lies on the southern part of Jakarta. Many faculties are located in this new campus area. Guest House UI is called Wisma Makara, located in Depok Campus area which can be reaching by car or train.

By car: the trip will take about one hour from Jakarta city centre along regular road or about 30 minutes along inner city toll road. From Jakarta International Airport (Soekarno-Hatta Airport), the trip takes about one and a half to two hours via toll road. Traveling by taxi from the airport will cost around Rp 300,000. Please provide the taxi driver with money for toll fees around Rp 20,000. After exiting all toll gates, the driver will give you the changes should there are some.

By train: to get to Depok campus by train, take any of regular (Jabotabek) trains (stretched from Kota to Bogor) to Depok/Bogor. Hop off at UI or Pondok Cina station. Every point in the campus is accessible by yellow campus bus, which serves for free. Wait at the bus stop if you intend to take the bus or "ojek" (a rented motorcycle equipped with a driver) if you are in a hurry. Ojek's tariff normally starts from Rp 5,000, depending on the distance.
